

Constitution

Preamble

It is hereby declared and decreed that the purpose of this Association, the Central Ohio Purgatorial Society, is:

- 1. To promote the devotion of offering spiritual works of mercy for the Holy Souls in Purgatory, also known as the Church Penitent;
- 2. To provide mutual support and resources for those who have a personal devotion to offering spiritual works of mercy for the Holy Souls in Purgatory;
- 3. To encourage members to spread the devotion to the Holy Souls in Purgatory within their own parish;
- 4. To promote the attendance of parishioners at funeral Masses;
- 5. To work with individual parishes to form parish-level groups that attend funeral Masses and offer spiritual works of mercy for recently-departed parishioners;
- 6. To offer corporal and spiritual works of mercy for the families of recently-departed parishioners;
- 7. To offer Masses for the Holy Souls in Purgatory.

Article I: Name

The name of this Association shall be the Central Ohio Purgatorial Society.

Article II: Headquarters

The Headquarters for this Association shall be Saint Michael Catholic Church located at 5750 N. High Street, Worthington, Ohio 43085,

Article II: Purpose

The Purpose is set forth in the Preamble of this Constitution. The Association pledges to work in harmony with the doctrines and laws of the Roman Catholic Church and operate under the authority of the Bishop of the Diocese of Columbus.

Article III: Association Governance

- 1. This Constitution shall be the governing document of the Association.
- 2. A meeting of all Officers must be held at least once every 12 months.
- 3. A meeting of the general membership shall be held at least once every 12 months for the purposes of electing officers.
- 4. An Officers' meeting may be called by any Officer at any time.
- 5. All Officers must be present to vote.
- 6. Amendments to this Constitution must be made by a simple majority vote of the Officers.
- 7. Changes to or determination of Association policies must be made by a simple majority of the Officers.

Article IV: Conditions of Membership

For membership in the organization, a person must be:

- 1. of the age of reason
- 2. a Catholic in good standing in their parish, and
- 3. be of good moral character

Article V: Association Duties and Qualifications

Section 1: Organization

1. The Association is made up of Officers and Members

Section 2: Selection of Officers

- 1. Selection of officers is by a general election at the designated annual meeting
- 2. Officers are nominated for election by the general membership in attendance
- 3. Officers are elected by a simple majority vote of members in attendance.
- 4. Officers terms shall run for a 12 month term.

Section 2: Duties of Officers

- 1. The Officers are tasked with ensuring the Association is operating in a manner that most effectively achieves the Purpose, by means of working to promote the Association and providing resources to the Members. The Officers are:
 - A. *Director*: Tasked with the overall execution of the Purpose to include but not be limited to:
 - i. Ensure a website is maintained
 - ii. Ensure a contact list of Members is maintained
 - iii. Ensure materials such as pamphlets, flyers, and cards are readily available
 - iv. Ensure parishes in the Central Ohio area are contacted and informed about the Association, its Purpose, and the resources available
 - v. Ensure Masses are said on the first Tuesday of months December through October with the intention of the Holy Souls in Purgatory
 - B. *Vice Director*: Tasked with assisting the Director in the overall execution of the Purpose and keeping basic meeting minutes

- C. Chaplain: Tasked with providing spiritual direction to the Association
- 2. Members are tasked with the execution of the Purpose, under the direction of the Officers.

Section 3: Qualifications of Officers

- 1. The Director and Vice Director must:
 - A. Be Catholics in good standing in their parish
 - B. Have received the Sacrament of Confirmation
 - C. Be 21 years of age
 - D. Be of good moral character
- 2. The Chaplain must:
 - A. Be an ordained Priest or Deacon of the Catholic Church in good standing and with full faculties
 - B. Be assigned to a parish or other Diocesan office in the Diocese of Columbus

Article VI: Patron Saint

The patron saint of the organization shall be St. Catherine of Genoa.

Promoted Prayers and Devotions

The Association, as part of its Purpose, shall promote the following:

Section 1: Promoted Prayers

- 1. The Chaplet for the Dead (See Appendix I)
- 2. Prayers for the Holy Souls In Purgatory (See Appendix II)
- 3. The Prayer of St. Gertrude the Great (See Appendix III)
- 4. A Prayer to Be Said at the Consecration (See Appendix IV)

Section 2: Devotions

- 1. First Tuesday Devotion which shall occur on the first Tuesday of every month from December through October:
 - M. All Officers and Members shall take part in this devotion
 - i. A fast from midnight until 7pm as determined by each individual, based on their state of life (i.e. a Black Fast, a water-only fast, a bread and water fast, fasting and abstinence, et cetera)
 - ii. Attendance at Mass and reception of the Eucharist
 - iii. Recitation of the Promoted Prayers
 - N. All Officers and Members shall promote this devotion
- 2. On All Souls' Day, all Officers and Members shall:
 - O. Fast from midnight until 7pm as determined by each individual, based on their state of life (i.e. a Black Fast, a water-only fast, a bread and water fast, fasting and abstinence, et cetera)
 - P. Attend Mass and receive the Eucharist
 - Q. Recite the Promoted Prayers
 - R. Visit a cemetery and pray the five Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary for the Holy Souls in Purgatory

Appendix I: The Chaplet for the Dead

The Chaplet resembles a standard Rosary, except it has only four decades instead of five. It starts on the Cross, and has 4 introductory prayers, followed by 4 decades starting with 1 Pater bead (typically red) and 10 Ave beads (typically black). The 5 Pater beads represent the 5 wounds of Christ. The 40 Ave beads are in memory of the 40 hours which Our Lord is thought to have spent in Limbo. There are 49 beads total. A partial indulgence is granted and applied to the souls in Purgatory for each recitation of this chaplet. The Chaplet was established by the Archconfraternity of Our Lady of Suffrage in Nimes, France, and approved by Pope Pius IX in 1873.

On the Cross:

V: Out of the depths have I cried unto Thee, O Lord;

R: Lord, hear my voice.

V: Let thine ears be attentive

R: to the voice of my supplication.

V: If thou, O Lord, shalt observe our iniquities,

R: O Lord, who shall endure it?

V: For with thee there is merciful forgiveness;

R: and by reason of Thy law, I have waited for Thee, O Lord.

V: My soul hath relied on His word:

R: my soul hath hoped in the Lord.

V: From the morning watch even until night,

R: let Israel hope in the Lord.

V: Because with the Lord there is mercy,

R: and with Him plentiful redemption.

V: And he shall redeem Israel

R: from all his iniquities.

On the first Pater (red bead):

 \dot{V} : Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord.

R: And let perpetual light shine upon them.

Act of Faith (first black bead):

V: My God, I believe in Thee,

R: because Thou art Truth itself; I firmly believe the truths revealed to the Church.

Act of Hope (second black bead):

V: My God, I hope in Thee,

R: because Thou art infinitely good.

Act of Charity (third black bead):

∛: My God, I love Thee with all my heart, and above all things,

R: because Thou art infinitely perfect; and I love my neighbor as myself, for the love of Thee.

On all the Paters (red beads):

V: Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord.

R: And let perpetual light shine upon them.

On All the Aves (black beads):

V: Sweet Heart of Jesus,

R: be my love.

V: Sweet Heart of Mary,

R: be my salvation.

At the End:

V: Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord.

R: And let perpetual light shine upon them.

V: May the souls of all the faithfully departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

R: Amen.

V: May the love of God and the peace of the Lord Jesus Christ bless us and console us and gently wipe every tear from our eyes.

R: Amen.
